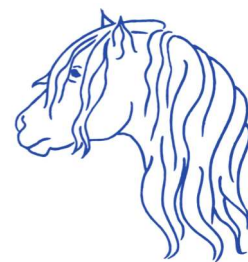

## VERSATILITY BONUS POINTS

To gain versatility bonus points, a pony must compete at least twice in a minimum of two types of activity. (NB Elimination from classes will not count towards versatility). Two types of activity gain 20 points and for each event after that another 20 is awarded e.g. 3 events 40pts, 4 events 60pts, ..... 6 events 100pts, ..... 8 events 140pts and so on.

**NB** Double points will be awarded for the following shows:

**Scotland:** Royal Highland, HPS Breed Show, Scone Palace HP Show, NPS Scotland Scone Finals, CSHPC Summer Show, NESHPE Summer Show.

**England:** Southern HP Show, Equifest, NPS Malvern, BSPS Heritage Champs, Cheshire, Great Yorkshire, Royal Windsor Horse Show, Royal Bath and West, London International & HOYS

**Wales:** Pembrokeshire County Show

### Notes

- Any activities not listed should be included on the card and the Secretary will calculate points appropriately.
- Team Quest, Ridden Tack and Turnout, video and online competitions, lessons & clinics **do not** count for points.
- Please do not write in shaded areas and use one line for each class and a separate line for championships.

**PERFORMANCE AWARD SCHEME**

- 1 The Performance Award is a competitive scheme aimed at encouraging the use of Highland ponies. It runs for one year from 1 January to 31 December. These rules apply to England & Wales and to Scotland.
- 2 Presentations will be made to England & Wales and to Scotland.
- 3 It is for ridden and driving ponies only, **not in-hand**.
- 4 Ponies must belong to paid up members of the Society.
- 5 Passports must be up to date and reflect the correct registered owner of the pony.
- 6 The riders/drivers need not be a member of the Society.
- 7 Ponies must be 5 years old or over.
- 8 The scheme is open to stallions, mares and geldings fully registered or in Appendices.
- 9 The card is issued in the name of the pony and each rider/driver combination must have a separate card.
- 10 Points are also awarded for participation.
- 11 Record the number in the class.
- 12 Record your placing in the placing box on the applicable page using a separate line for each class and each championship. Do not record any event more than once. Please do not write in the shaded area. The Secretary uses this area to record your points.
- 13 Points may be collected at shows and properly organised events. Schedules may have to be submitted to committee if required.
- 14 Cards may be obtained from either secretary (names and addresses below). Please send a large stamped self-addressed envelope and give full contact details including mobile number and email address. Cards are also available via the HPS Website. There is no charge for cards once again in 2026. Payment for postage only is required.
- 15 All competitors who return their cards will receive a rosette.
- 16 The Glenda Spooner overall trophies cannot be won more than three times by the same pony.
- 17 Winners of the £100 Training Bursary (riders/drivers) must be, or become members of the Society.
- 18 If the Award Bursary is given, it must be applied for within one year. The receipt for tuition to the value of the award should be submitted to the Secretary of the Highland Pony Society.
- 19 A junior competition for riders aged 18 years or under on 1<sup>st</sup> January of the year of the award and a competition for rider/drivers aged 50 and over will be held in both schemes.
